"Console my people, console them" says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low. Let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it: for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear. say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

# Adoration changes people and parishes

## What am I suppose to do during Eucharistic Adoration?

If you sign up to be an "adorer" you can schedule yourself for one or more hours per week to pray before the very presence of Our Lord, exposed in the monstrance. It means that you can have some time alone with Jesus to recite your favourite prayers, read the bible, pray a rosary or do whatever type of prayerful devotion that suits you before Our Lord. You can just sit and say nothing simply keeping Him company, just as you would with a dear friend. The important thing is to realize that you need time to experience God's personal care for you alone.

There are basically four kinds of prayer most appropriate in the presence of the Eucharist, namely adoration and praise, thanksgiving, repentance and intercession. While your adoration experience will be unique to you, here are some suggestions for what to do during your Holy Hour:

Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours. Recite the "Jesus Praver". Meditate using Scripture. Read the life of a saint and pray with him or her. Pour out your heart to Christ and adore him. Ask for forgiveness and intercede for others. Pray the Rosary. Sit quietly and just "be" in the presence of God.
