The 'Fro Has To Go

An interview with Andres Hernandez about his experience with the youth pilgrimages.

- Q: This will be your sixth Youth Pilgrimage. Why did you decide to go in the first place?
- A: I liked the idea of going to Ireland, meeting new people and having an adventure.
- Q: What has been your most memorable event?
- A: Going to Poland in 2016 for World Youth Day. It was amazing to go to the field where we celebrated Mass with the Pope along with 1-2 million others. I enjoyed talking to people and seeing how far everyone traveled to be there for their faith and to celebrate Mass.
- Q: How have these trips helped you grow in your faith?
- A: I was 15 when I first went and I had gone to confession only once. I was given the opportunity to grow and think deeper about my faith because it is a time set apart from normal life. I made good friends to help me to continue to grow in my faith when I came home. These pilgrimages have also helped me to appreciate things in my life, like my family, friends, house... even my bed! While climbing the mountains, I was even inspired by other pilgrims who were climbing barefoot; something I had never seen before. Those mountains were hard to climb, but were well worth it with the amazing peace we found at the top.
- Q: What were the challenges?
- A: It was hard to pray every day. I had to learn how to say the Hail Mary and, at the beginning, when it came time to say the rosary, we were all falling asleep! By the end of the pilgrimage though we were actually enjoying it. Patience was also challenging when other teens didn't want to go to sleep after a long day. It was also difficult for me to transition from being a youth to a youth leader. More responsibility... but worth it!

- Q: What have you learned about being a leader?
- A: Lots of planning! It's also more fulfilling because you can help the teens grow in their faith and share your own life experience with them. You see them change during the course of their pilgrimage.
- Q: How would you encourage a teen to go?
- A: The pilgrimages are different from other trips you might go on. You will grow in your faith, see different cultures, make lasting friendships (even if you are shy like me), and appreciate the life you have now. The trips are reminders of why we have our faith and that God is always with us. Even if we have fallen away from the faith during the year- it is a time of renewal. You will remember these pilgrimages for life.
- Q: What can you say to all the benefactors?
- A: Thank you so much for helping us go! When you are investing in these teens, you are putting money into forming our future church. Thank you for providing for us and supporting us. Without your help a lot of the youth would not be able to go- especially those families that have more than one teen going. It really is money well spent.
- Q: Andres, it is very kind of you to have a fundraiser to cut your hair. Are you ready to lose your locks?
- A: No... but the youth and other leaders have convinced me it's worth it. And if I were looking for a reason to do it, it would be hard to find a better one.


