There are four especially easy and very fruitful ways to get a plenary indulgence during Lent.


Remember that a Plenary Indulgence completely removes before God punishment due for sins that have already been forgiven.

Pray "Look Down Upon Me, Good and Gentle Jesus" on a Friday in Lent and Passiontide, after receiving Eucharist before Adore the Blessed Sacrament for 30 minutes. an image of Christ crucified.

"Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus, while before your face I humbly kneel, and with burning soul pray and beseech you to fix deep in my heart lively sentiments of faith, and a firm purpose of amendment, while I contemplate with great love and tender pity your five wounds, pondering over them within me, calling to mind the words which David, your prophet, said of you, my good Jesus: "They have pierced my hands and my feet; they have numbered all my bones."

Pray in the church or in the chapel after receiving Eucharist at Mass.
